

CORRADO ROMANO

born in 1920, was a violinist and a pedagogue.

Together with Ginette Neveu and Henryk Szeryng he was a pupil of Carl Flesch in Berlin.

In 1943 Romano was awarded with the first prize at the Geneva Violin Competition (2nd prize was Henryk Szeryng).

He studied composition with Paul Hindemith and he held a 40 years long

professorship of "Virtuosité" at the Geneva Conservatory. He was also the main teacher of the "Accademia di Alta Formazione Artistica e Musicale Lorenzo Perosi" in Biella, Italy.

Extraordinary talented and sensitive pedagogue, among his pupils he had some of the most famous contemporary Italian violinist, such as Uto Ughi, Domenico Nordio and Marco Fornaciari.

He died in Geneva in 2003.
